Exodus 1–4

Bible Storytelling Tips

- **Use props:** Show story-related objects as you tell the story. Use a baby doll, a basket, a stuffed or plastic sheep, branches from a bush, and a sandal.
- **Draw and follow:** Post three blank sheets of paper in different locations around the room. While telling the story, guide preschoolers to follow you. On one sheet of paper, draw water and a basket with a baby while talking about baby Moses. Move to the next sheet and draw a sheep while mentioning that when Moses was older, he was a shepherd and took care of sheep. Move to the next sheet and draw a bush and fire.
